Patricia Despite the cold and windy weather and a few muddy areas, Lakeside LFZ continues to

be a popular destination for dogs, owners and walkers at all times of the day.

· Arrests have been made in the case of two vehicle break-ins in the Lakeside parking lot last October and November.

Peel Regional Police informed me that 2 parties are in custody, arrested by Toronto Police, and linked to numerous incidents between Toronto and Burlington.

Both Peel and Halton Police Services will be charging these parties.

Further, a lone individual was linked to 22 counts in late November but has since been released.

The thieves worked in an organized team, with someone possibly inside the park keeping an eye out, while another broke into the vehicles.

A third would be ready to receive what ever was taken and drive off and possible others were involved to hand off to down the road.

· While it is good to hear of these arrests, we must be mindful of others still perpetrating these crimes.

Parkway Belt

Gary - What initiated my involvement with this LFM group back in December was a dog, while in my care, jumping the fence at Parkway when she saw a rabbit. There were no dire consequences but it got me thinking. I met up with Patricia at the park shortly afterwards to discuss the fencing issues. We decided it was inadequate only for the south & west boundaries which border on Eglinton Avenue & the walking/biking path respectively. The north & east portions of the perimeter fencing have the proper chain-link style. Since then, it has also become a priority of mine to enlist paid memberships for Parkway. So far, it has been very frustrating, although one member did round up some substantial donations through business contacts. I continue to pester those 'regulars' that I know are avoiding the payments.

Parkway Belt is basically a barren, elevated wasteland....very cold & windy. First-timers are never prepared for the difference in temperature just walking from the parking lot. (However it does drain well due to the elevation & the wind...so we are in pretty good shape during wet conditions while most other parks would be 'mud bowls'.) Although days are gradually

becoming longer as we head into spring, for most of the winter all I see there are a handful of 'regulars', even on weekends. Lately the winding path from the parking lot (approx. 200m) has been very icy, almost too dangerous for most people with their dogs to even attempt it. Ice has also formed at the park entrance, & the inner gate is permanently jammed with snow / ice & frozen in an open position. There is nothing on the bulletin board these days other than an outdated membership roster, & a poster for an already past Lab fundraiser. We have 3 decrepit picnic tables within the park where people congregate. My own dog cut himself for stitches a few weeks ago on the sharp, jagged corner of the bench portion when he slipped while playing.

There was also an unsuccessful attempt to plant some small trees in the park last year. These saplings have now been all chewed down to just small twigs sticking out of the ground & peed on so much that they will probably never grow again. Although having some shade in the park would be a great idea, planting these young trees was a total waste of money in my opinion.
